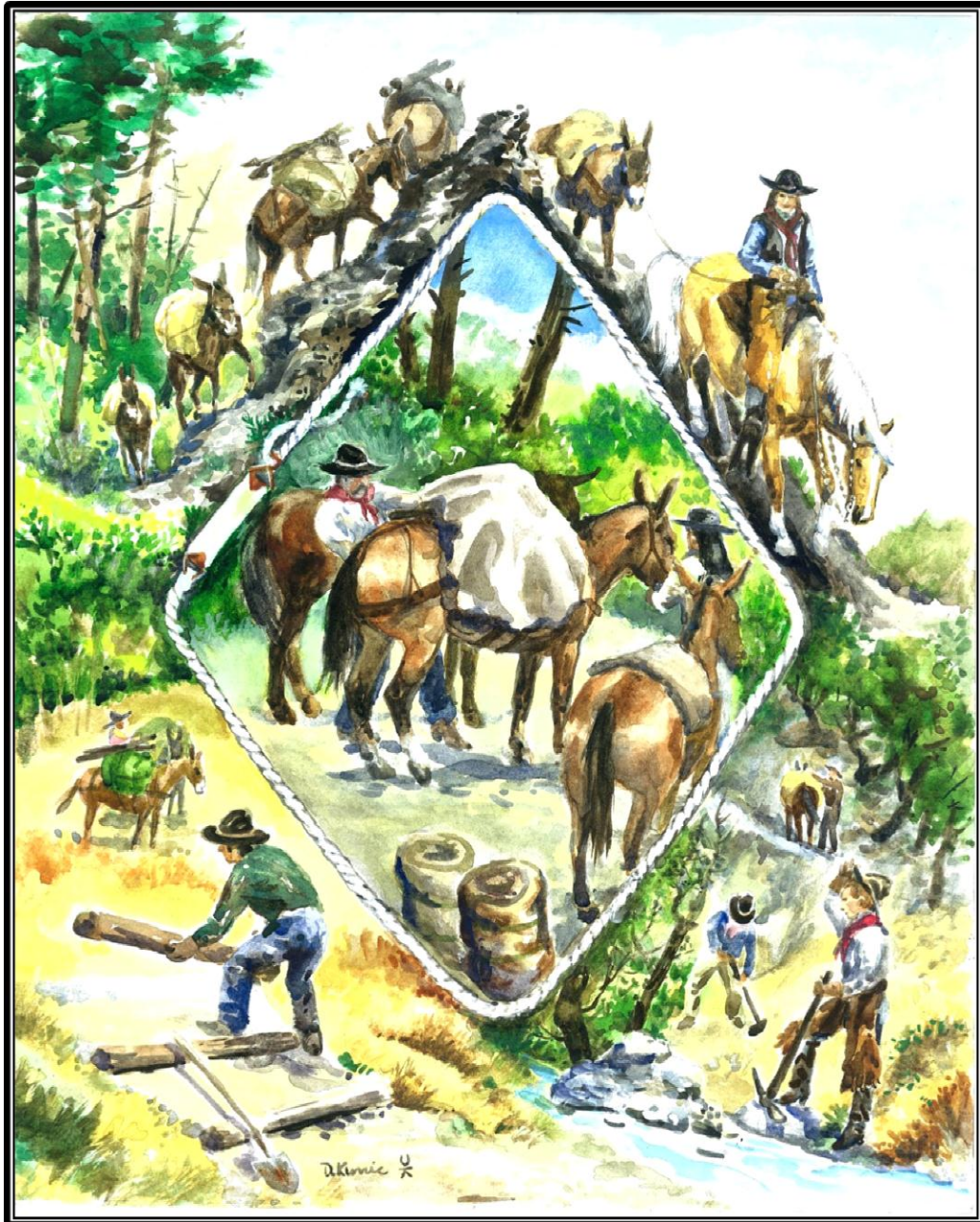

Our training program assists both the animal and owner with achieving expected results in a safe and effective manner. The range of training offered includes starting a young or green-broke horse or mule, re-training and problem solving for stock that have developed undesirable behaviors.

Jerry's emphasis is establishing a solid foundation; making sure the animal understands and can comfortably perform the basic principles of soft, flexible movement, while also developing good manners. This program is strongly recommended for all aspects of handling, including riding, packing and driving. It is equally suitable to English or Western riding traditions.

The owner must recognize and be aware of the level of training at which their animal currently functions when he is brought to school.

Issues to be considered include temperament, previous schooling and attitude.

Considering these factors, the time commitment for your expected result will vary from animal to animal.

In other words, 90 days with one horse may not produce the same level of performance as 90 days with another. Jerry will evaluate your animal and discuss with you your wishes and expectations, and he will devise a training plan to help you reach your goals. In many cases, this will include training for you as well as your animal.

What you will learn at the 2011 Rendezvous

Demo 1, understanding and fitting tack, looking at the good, the bad and the ugly tack, and what it can do to your animal, proper bit use, a look at good and bad bits, fitting britchens, breast collar, riding saddles and pack gear

Demo 2, Understanding mule mentality and your training techniques, breaking the myth that mules are harder to train, don't put all mules into the same category, the same training technique will not work on all mules, be willing to break your training down so your mule understands what you want it to do.

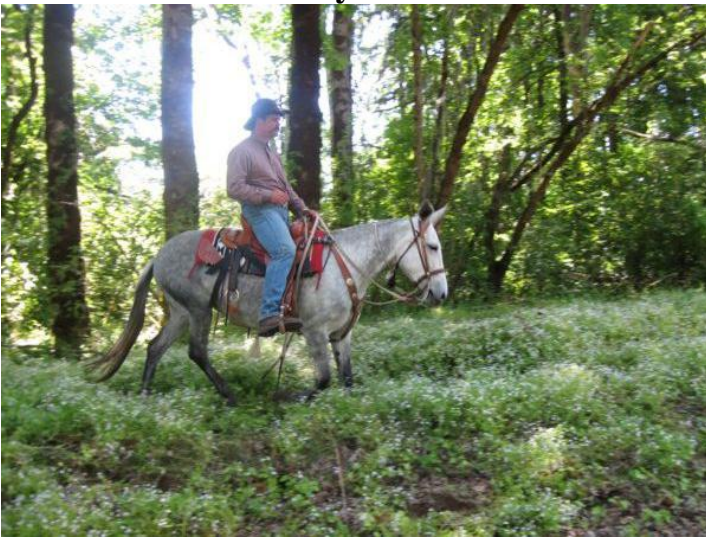

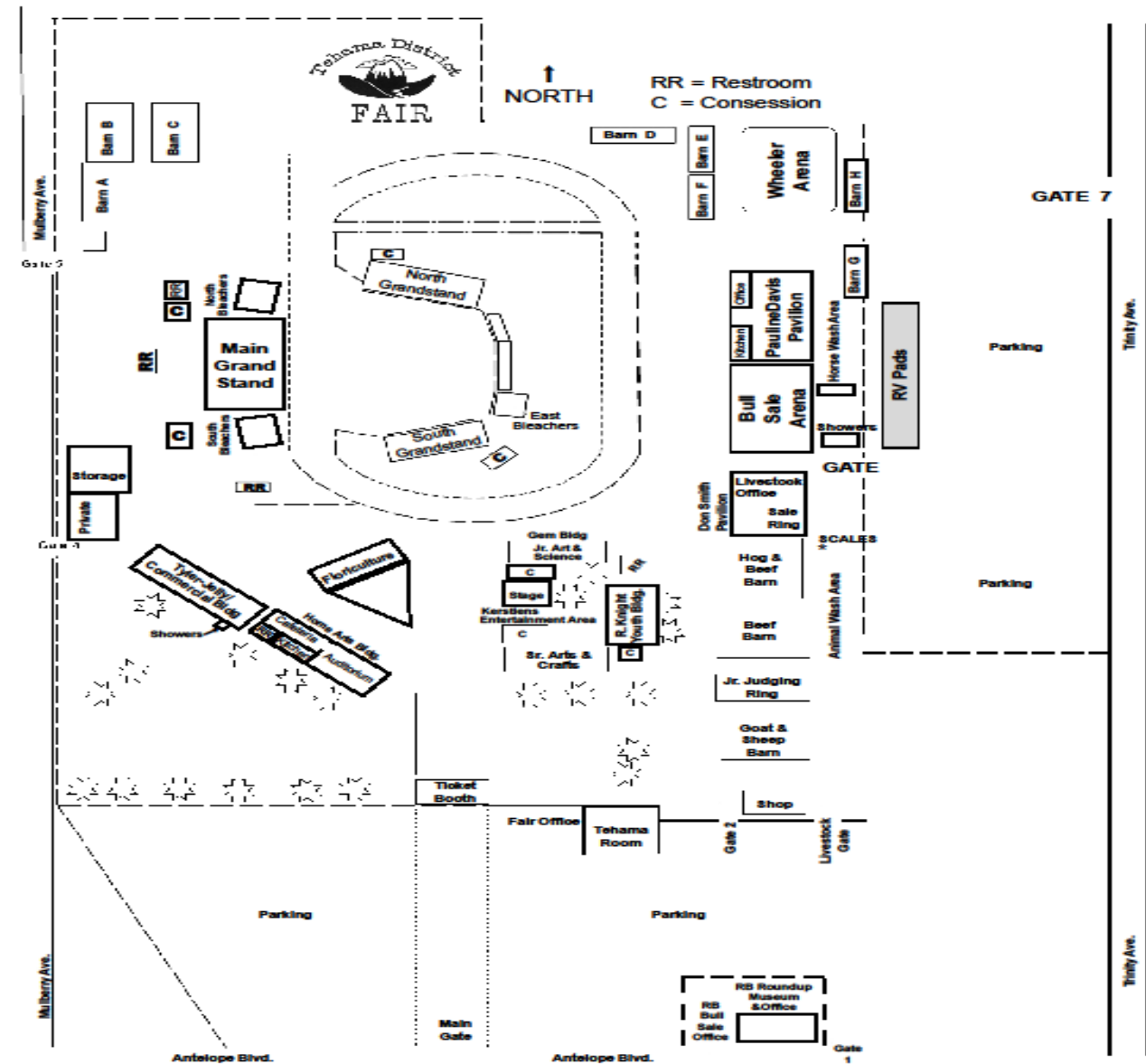

Traveling South on Interstate 5; Take Exit #649; at the top of the off ramp turn left (you will be on Antelope Blvd. at that point); travel 1.4 mile and turn left into the Fairgrounds.

Traveling North on Interstate 5; Take Exit #649; at the top of the off ramp turn right (you will be on Antelope Blvd. at that point); travel 1.2 miles and turn left into the Fairgrounds.

Traveling from the East on Hwy. 36 you will come to the intersection of Hwy. 36 and Antelope Blvd.; turn right; travel .9 miles and turn right into the Fairgrounds.

Traveling North on Hwy. 99 it becomes Antelope Blvd.; stay on Antelope Blvd. and travel .9 miles past the Hwy 36 junction; turn right into the Fairgrounds.

US Forest Service presenting Pack stock and Packing Techniques in the Wilderness



The US forest Service will be presenting a program that will include packing history, packing techniques and methods old and new, and demonstrations including packing of mules with various items used in the back country and a camp set-up. U S Forest Service Packers Ken Graves, Michael Morse and Lee Roeser will show and demonstrate camping with stock in Trailhead and Backcountry settings. Presented will be information on how to camp at trailheads in a manner that preserves the right to continue to use the public areas for recreational stock use. How to pack into the Backcountry for overnight or extended trips and impact the land with as little disturbance as possible therefore preserving the use of stock in the

Backcountry for future generations. Techniques of Stock Management, Camping, and Packing both historical and up to date will be presented. Come by our Demo and help preserve history and ensure the future of stock use on public lands.

Lee Roeser is from the Eastern Sierra out of Independence, California and the Eight Mile Ranch. Lee's family has been in the packing business since the 1950's. Lee has over 40 years of packing experience and is currently working for the Inyo National Forest as the Forest Packer. He has packed from the Los Padre National Forest on the south to the Shasta Trinity National Forest on the north.



Michael Morse is from Mammoth Lakes California and has worked for the Mammoth Ranger District for 35 years. Michael started his career in packing working for a private pack outfit and later signed up with the Forest Service in 1973. Michael is the Wilderness and Trails Supervisor for the North Zone of the Inyo National Forest. He is also the supervisor of the Forest stock operation including logistics for projects on other forests. He is a "Leave No Trace Master" and teaches wilderness ethics to Fire Crews that may be operating in the wilderness.



Both Lee and Michael hold certifications for firefighting and often spend their summer packing on fire assignments. Lee and Michael have packed bridges, trail crews, wilderness rangers, Fish and Game and special interest groups throughout the state. Their primary job is packing gear and equipment into the High Sierra on the Inyo National Forest. Ken Graves is a fifth generation packer from northern California where he grew up on a cattle ranch. He has packed for the U S Forrest Service for 34 years and has packed trail crews and fire crews in many backcountry locations throughout California.

DUTCH OVEN COOK-OFF

BCHC RENDEZVOUS 2011

IF YOU ENJOY COOKING IN THE OUTDOORS AND WOULD LIKE TO SHARE YOUR SKILLS, HERE IS THE EVENT FOR YOU!

ENTRY FEE: \$20.00 per team

DATE & SCHEDULE: The Cook-Off will be held on Saturday, April 2, 2011

Check in: 8:30 – 9:00 am

Cooks Meeting: 9:10 am (draw for presentation order)

Cooking time: 9:30 – 11:30 am

Awards Presentation: 12:00 pm

LOCATION: The Cook-Off will take place at the fairgrounds in Red Bluff, CA

CATEGORIES: Amateur Division is a ONE POT MAIN DISH Cook-Off; the recipe must include a beef ingredient. Professional Division is a ONE POT MAIN DISH Cook-Off; ONE POT BREAD and a ONE POT DESSERT.

Basic fire pits if needed and notified prior to rendezvous, for each team, kitchen facilities for clean up, judges and wonderful prizes. You may provide your own fire pit as long as it protects the ground from heat damage.

CONTESTANTS WILL PROVIDE: Dutch Ovens, culinary water, charcoal, lighter fluid, cooking utensils, all food and other essential items necessary to prepare their recipe(s). All cooking must be done at least 12" from the ground.

TEAMS: Contestant teams will consist of two persons. One member must be over the age of 18 and the other over the age of 12. Spectators are welcome but only team members will be allowed inside the Cook-Off area.

DRESS: Dress should reflect "western" or "pioneer" attire.

JUDGING: Team contestants will be judged in one of two divisions: Amateur or Professional. Professionals are team members who have been paid to prepare Dutch Oven meals or who are Dutch Oven caterers or who have competed before. Entries will be judged on aroma, appearance, taste, quality of entry, team dress, cooking technique, spectator interaction and presentation. All team entrants will prepare contest recipe during the Cook-Off. Teams who prepare portions or all of an entry prior to the contest will be disqualified. A judging criteria sheet will be mailed to all entrants.

RECIPES: All recipes must be included with you Entry Form and Entry Fee.

RECIPE RELEASE: Your names, photograph and/or recipe may be selected for use by various media covering these events as well as future Dutch Oven Cook-Offs. Your entry in the Rendezvous 2011 Dutch Oven Cook-Off establishes your agreement for the release of the same and their use by the Cook-Off Committee, the Cook-Off sponsors and the media.

PRIZES: Amateur Division – 1st place, 2nd Professional Division – TBA

HEALTH & SAFETY: Contestants are solely responsible for the proper selection, storage and refrigeration (if necessary) of all ingredients, the sanitation of their cooking area and the preparation of foods that are safe for human consumption. Aside from a simple rope barrier separating cooking and spectator areas, responsibility for safety of contestants and spectators rests solely with the contestants. Safe use of fires, other heat sources and cooking equipment is the responsibility of the individual contestants.

FOOD SAMPLE DISTRIBUTION: In so much as there are strict laws governing the distribution of food to the general public, the BCHC Dutch Oven Cook-Off Committee and Rendezvous 2011 Committee do not sanction, endorse, or encourage the distribution of "samples" of any food to the general public. Contestants who wish to give sample must provide their own serving utensils and sample cup containers.

DISCLAIMER: Judges' decisions on contestant rules and the Cook-Off Committee's decision on policies and procedure are final. Complete contestant rules will be distributed to all Cook-Off teams at the Cook-Off and are available upon request.
